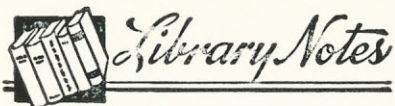

We are in need of additional homes for these girls for the night of Tuesday, April 11. If you can care for one or more, please call the church office.

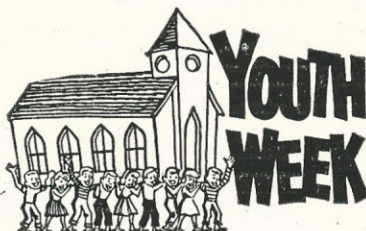
