Pastor's Paragraphs

PLANNED NEGLECT

I read the following story recently and wished to share it with you:

A noted young concert artist was asked the secret of her success, with her violin. "Planned Neglect," she replied and then explained.



"There were many things which demanded my time. When I went to my room after breakfast, I made my bed, straightened my room, dusted the floor and did whatever

came to my attention. When I finished my work, I turned my attention to violin practice. That system failed to accomplish the result desired, so I reversed things. I deliberately planned to neglect everything else until my practice period was completed. That program of planned neglect accounts for my success."

Now the thought "Planned Neglect" may not sound good at the first reading, but it is essential to give priority in the use of our time if we are to become efficient in the service of our God. First priority to our responsibilities in the church will most certainly be rewarded with success and happiness. "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God . . . and all things shall be added to you." Have you ever heard some one make one of the following remarks: "I just haven't got time to visit the pupils in my class," "I just have so much to do that I can't get to choir rehearsal," "It is so hard for me to find time to study my lesson," "With all I have to do at home, it is almost impossible for me to get to Sunday School and Training Union."

No doubt you have heard these statements many times, but a little observation will prove that we all find time to do what we want to do most. I have often wondered how the God of our salvation feels when our remarks and attitudes reveal that we do not consider His program important enough to give it priority.

Honor God by being in God's House Sunday. I will see you then—1300 Bibles strong.
