IMPORTANT! NEXT WEEK'S SCHEDULE

The electrical service to all of our church buildings will be cut off from Monday through Friday of next week, October 16 through 20, as necessary changes are made in the power service to the church.

On Wednesday night, we will have Prayer Service at the Technical High School auditorium one block north of the church on Palafox Street beginning at 7:30 p.m. There will be no nursery facilities available. The choir, Fellowship Dinner, choir groups, auxiliaries, and other meetings usually held on Wednesday will not be held.

Temporary service is being provided for lights in the office area, so the office will be open as usual.

We regret these inconveniences, but will all remember that these problems are in the interest of progress.

The congregation of the First Baptist Church unanimously adopted the 1962 budget of \$255,339.00 during the morning worship service, Sunday, October 8th. The new budget includes a \$5,000 increase in gifts to the Cooperative Program and \$2,000 which will pay the basic salary of a missionary on the foreign field. Additional funds are provided for mortgage obligations to be assumed with the construction of a new educational building. Paul Caro, Chairman of the Budget Planning Committee, said, "The increase in next year's budget over 1961 will go to missions and our local building program. I am sure each member will want to make an offering each Sunday in 1962 toward the new budget. When we recognize that all we have comes from God, it will not be hard to give."

Forward Program Committees meantime stepped up their work pointing toward Loyalty Day, October 29th. Goals for each Sunday School Class have been set and will be posted in the classrooms next Sunday. Stewardship films are being shown in Adult Departments of Sunday School. A. H. Arnold, Charman of the Budget Pledging Committee, has begun enlisting canvassers to visit a number of homes during the final week of stewardship emphasis.






