thrilled when nine people united with our church. The Good Lord willing, four of these will be baptized Sunday evening.

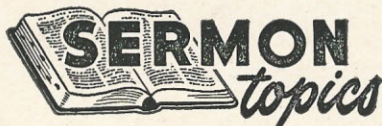

THE CHRISTMAS ORATORIO

The writer of our Christmas work for this year was among the greatest writers of all time. It was through his efforts and the inspiration of his contemporaries that a national musical style was born. Certainly some of the best literature from the classical period came from Camille Saint-Saens. This composer wrote the Biblical opera "Samson and Delilah" in 1877.

An Oratorio is generally thought of as a dramatic poem of a sacred or spiritual nature which is sung throughout by soloists and chorus accompanied by an orchestra. The organ and piano have replaced the orchestra many times because of apparent practical reasons. This type of work, although differing from a mass or cantata, has a peculiar style described as very dramatic; it must be enacted without the benefit of staging or costumes and is ideally suited for performance by church choirs.

A chorus made up of our Sanctuary and Youth Choirs will present this musical service on Sunday evening, December 10, at 7:15 p.m.

All the choirs of the church will present a service of carols on Sunday evening, December 17, at 7:15 p.m. This is always a stirring service and you will be pleased as each group rehearses and prepares suitable music to offer in praise of the Child Jesus.
