

## A SALUTE TO JOHN GLENN

All the free world is paying tribute to John Glenn. How refreshing it is to have a new kind of hero like this astronaut.



My good friend, T. L. McSwain of Kentucky, recently wrote these words about him:

"At a time when people are wearing out their clothes from the inside doing the twist, at a time when morals are incredibly low, when sex crazy Hollywood stars are idolized, it is indeed comforting and encouraging to see a clean-cut, Christian gentleman become a great hero. John Glenn has given a tremendous Christian witness along with his family. His religion is real and many a boy should be influenced toward clean and sober living. God surely must be pleased.

It was interesting to read that Glenn stated to newsmen that his religion is lived every day and that he did not spend all his time in the capsule praying—he was **prayed up**. His vital faith helped him and he gave thanks to God. How different from the Russian Cosmonaut. America has gained greatly in prestige by letting the whole world in on our space shot and I was very glad that Christian John Glenn gave a world wide witness that should help our great cause.

What a contrast there is between our astronaut and the two Russians who orbited the earth.

Titov and Gagarin came back from outer space saying, "We found no God in space."

John Glenn came back from outer space with his faith as strong as ever.

They brought back exactly what they took with them.

For the Russians to say, "There is no God out there," is very interesting. How far into outer space have they gone?

An illustration might reveal how significant man's accomplishments are.

If the sun were a steel ball six inches in diameter, earth would be about 55 feet away and Pluto about half a mile away—but the nearest star would be about 3,000 miles away—and even these are but near neighbors in the vastness of the Milky Way, in which our telescope can pick up about one trillion galaxies.

## THE Singing CHURCH

### INTERMEDIATE CHOIR RESUMES WORK

Because of schedule difficulties and a busy school season, our work was discontinued with the Intermediate Choir last fall. We're anxious to see what strides we can make together as we make up for lost time.

Enrollment is open to all 13 and 14 year youth. We have a source of more than 80 who may apply for membership. To make our work in this choir more interesting and profitable to these young singers, we offer these considerations:

1. Our purpose is to study, learn, and train to become singers. This will not be a social time.
2. Only those who expect to maintain regular attendance will be considered for membership.
3. The choir will sing at occasional Wednesday and Sunday evening services but will not accept a regular service responsibility.
4. Special attention will be given to correct breathing, diction, tone quality, the changing voice and sympathetic effort in development of a choral tone.

Parents are urged to use discretion in scheduling any activity or allowing any conflict which would make it impossible or impractical for their Intermediate to be in his place in choir. No absence because of social reasons will be excused. Only absences to be excused will be illness or death in the family.
