

ABOUT THOSE PARKING TICKETS

I am sure that we do not need to tell those who received tickets for improper parking last Sunday what to do with those parking tickets. You will need to do with those exactly what you would do with one received for parking improperly anywhere else in town. We probably will not need to remind these that they need to park properly from now on. We are concerned, however, that all of us understand that traffic laws are in effect on Sunday and that they apply to parking on the streets around the First Baptist Church as well as in other sections.

There are some specific violations which we call to your attention:

Parking on the wrong side of the street.

Parking on grass plots between sidewalk and curve (particular attention is called to Jackson Street where there is no parking on either side of the street in the block between Palafox and Guillemond).

Parking too close to corner.

Parking in front of church where the red curb designates a fire lane for emergency use.

Parking in front of driveways.

By the way, there is a large lot at the corner of Jackson and the railroad which is available for our use on Sundays.
