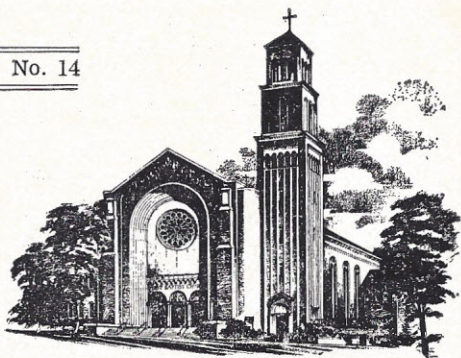

Dear Friend in Christ:

In writing to his people recently, Dr. H. Franklin Paschall, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Nashville, Tennessee,



made a request for prayer in behalf of their forthcoming revival that I could not improve upon in urging you to pray for our revival. These are his words:

Dr. J. H. Jowett once said, "Any man can build an altar, but only God can send the fire." So it is in a

ABOUT OUR YOUTH

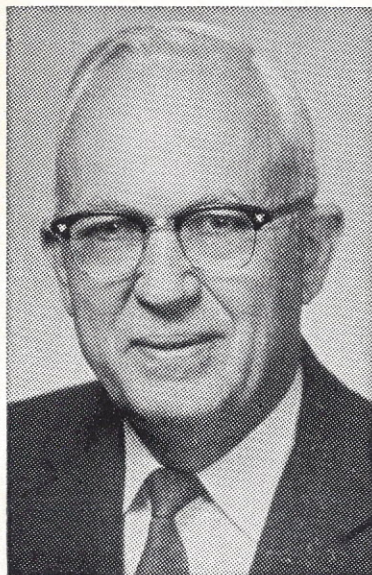
