CHANNEL 3 TO CARRY FILM ON MEDICAL MERCY MISSION

A film depicting inoculation of thousands of natives in Liberia by a medical mercy team from the United States will be carried on the American Broadcasting Company’s program, “Guns of Peace” at 2:00 P.M. on Sunday, April 29.

The inoculation of a major portion of the population here was carried out by a group of American doctors, headed by Dr. Robert A. Hingson of Cleveland, Ohio. The team injected crowds where they found them — at church, at soccer games, at school.

Filmed portions of the interracial, inter-faith mission appearing on the ABC-TV program will also deal with Southern Baptist mission work in Liberia, as well as present a general background of the little republic.

THE Singing CHURCH

CAUTION! BEWARE! NOTICE!
ATTENTION! IT’S CONTAGIOUS!

I am talking about the beautiful singing which our congregation did on last Sunday morning. It was apparent that almost everyone was participating in singing the great hymns which were telling again the great Easter narrative.

In other services there seems at times a rather apathetic attitude on the part of many during the period of singing. In a recent newspaper article this was noted: “The problem seems to be that the voice of the average layman singing in the congregation is not trained nor for that matter even exercised very often. Most men and about half the women seem to have difficulty reaching the pitches in the hymns.

The psychological factor must be recognized that embarrassment in attempting to reach the higher notes is usually a deterrent to enter participation in hymn singing.” We must begin to weigh the relative importance of the quality of church music on one hand and the desirability of maximum congregational participation on the other. If the congregational participation is to be the primary goal, then quality and harmony can be sacrificed in establishing the best singing range. Remember, the widow’s mite would not have meant much in building a cathedral; however, it was mightily blessed by our Lord and she was wealthy in her spirit through her willingness to give what she had. The Lord asks not for a Caruso quality, but a joyful noise. “I will praise thee, O Lord, among the people; and I will sing praises unto thee among the nation.” (Psalms 108:3).
