"Communism In Our World" by John C. Caldwell is a book for junior and senior high school students upon which parents and teachers can rely for facts about Communism. Authorities, including educators, who have read this book agree that in its objective and calm approach it fills an ever-growing and acutely felt need.

"Youth Seeks A Master" by Louis H. Evans is written as a challenge to youth to accept a life of devotion to Christ and one of disciplined service to mankind. He points out the reality of Christ's claims in the realm of intellect, one's possessions, one's physical being, service and the realm of the human heart. He brings the thrilling command of Christ to seek the wealth of His Kingdom and the joy of His righteousness.
