Of thoughts that cheer and bless!


If sorrow comes to me I know

PEOPLE AND PROBLEMS

Scarcely a day passes that someone does not call me about a serious problem. Many times there is something



Then, in quick, accurate, vivid strokes Dr. Stuber takes us through the period of persecution, the development of churches and creeds, the middle ages and the crusades, the Reformation. The major part of the book deals with the modern church in America, describing origins, major beliefs and growth of each group.

Dr. Stuber uses the primer approach that has made it the choice of church school teachers and laymen for more than thirty years.
