

Pastor's Paragraphs

"ALWAYS ASKING FOR MONEY"

Something that Dr. Roy McClain, pastor of the great Baptist Church in Atlanta, recently said is worthy of the close consideration of every Christian. He was writing of our needs to be good stewards of the material things of life. Evidently someone had remarked to him that this material needs should not be mentioned from the pulpit. In response Dr. McClain said: "The church is always asking for money." Glory be . . . indeed it is! And that without an apology! Why? The churches are asking that you simply reach down in your pockets and take God's money out of them and put it where it should have been all the time. That's it. Asking that you give to buy milk for empty stomachs; to buy clothes for cold, naked backs. Yes, the church is raising money, in many instances to put a decent roof over you and your children, to buy good hymn books from which you can sing, to heat in winter and air-condition in summer . . . just for the preacher's comfort? Hardly. For all those who would come in out of this pagan world of contradictions and get their souls right with God.

ASKING FOR MONEY, to send missionaries all over the world where we so unquestionably send out business men without counting the cost . . . missionaries to tell the world that much of what they are being told is a lie! To tell the truth which to know aright will set all men free. Money? Yes, indeed, but we never forget that it is God's to start with, and to ask God's people to share with Him what they should do without asking is no more an act of presumption than it is to ask a child to brush his teeth when it is for his unquestioned good. 'But, preacher I can't afford to give . . . why look at my debts and all the things we want and don't have.' That is just our trouble. One has ably characterized this generation as 'spending money that we don't have for things that we don't need, to impress people we don't like.' You know, it is bad enough to try to keep up with the Joneses, but to pass them on a curve is too much!"

Library Notes

When Harrison Pike was recently here, he said to friends of Mrs. Rosalie Mills Appleby, recently retired missionary to Brazil, "She has Brazil carved upon her heart. She has done and is continuing to do a magnificent job for that country. When she lived there she was my nearest neighbor in Belo Horizonte, five hundred miles away, and I treasured my visits with her." Dr. Malcolm Tolbeit, who preached for us last month, said Mr. Appleby's life had left its deep imprint upon Brazilians with whom she labored for thirty-six years. He, too, had known her there.

Mrs. Appleby went as a bride of one month to the country which was to completely steal her heart. Less than a year after the Applebys reached Brazil, Dr. Appleby died following an operation. On the day of his funeral his wife gave birth to their son. Mrs. Appleby bravely carried on alone the work they had set out to do, and in her new homeland she raised her son, now Dr. David Appleby, who teaches in the music department at Southwestern Seminary.

In addition to her dedicated evangelistic and school work, she translated literature into Portuguese. She somehow found time to write seven books in Portuguese and eight in English. She has another in process of printing, and yet another in her typewriter. All the royalties of her writings continue to go to Brazilian causes. She maintains a large correspondence with her Brazilian friends. There are many Brazilian "Rosalee's" named for her. She now lives in Canton, Mississippi, where she is an active member of First Baptist Church, when she is not in other places telling about Brazil. If you would like to read her beautifully written latest book, "White Wings of Splendor," it is in our church library, the gift of friends of Mrs. Appleby. — BTD.
