IF WE DARED! is a book of challenging devotional messages written by Dr. Chester E. Swor, one of Southern Baptists' most popular and loved speakers and counselors. In a usual year he travels 25,000 miles or more speaking and counseling with people in churches, colleges and in assemblies.

All Christians should want to know what is required to live triumphantly for Christ. IF WE DARED! helps one to find that the key lies in daring to follow Jesus in all of life's relationships.

In Part One of the book the Christian is invited to examine himself in the light of the example and teachings of Jesus concerning surrender, forgiveness, obedience, and prayer.

In Part Two the Christian is challenged to proceed toward maturity in stewardship of talent within his church, in Christian service outside his church, and in a better concept of cross-bearing, and in the art of a mature acceptance of what life brings.

In Part Three the Christian is bidden to ask himself four frank personal questions. In answering these questions honestly the Christian will discover still other areas in which he needs to apply the teachings of Christianity consistently and courageously.

Through the teachings of God's Word, his personal experiences and keen observations Chester Swor dares you to live victoriously. Why not get this book from our church library and give its suggestions a chance in your daily living.
