I have been wondering how on earth the reporter could make such a drastic mistake. Having an opportunity to think the matter through, I am beginning to understand how the mistake was made. Knowing that we have had 1192 people join the congregation in the past three years, he assumed that all these folks represented net gain to the membership. Unfortunately, this is not true. Actually, our net increase has been 329 or approximately fifteen per cent. I sincerely hope that in the future such a glowing report of a sixty per cent increase will indeed be the truth!

Another matter is even more disconcerting to me. Our membership secretary tells me we have 2281 resident church members. The fact of the matter is that a number of these folk mean little or nothing to the kingdom of God or to the First Baptist Church. I can't help but think of something Jesus said along this line: "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God." (Luke 9:62). In the mind of Jesus there is no such thing as an inactive church member.

I'll be looking for all of you Sunday in God's house.

SUNDAY SCHOOL PREPARATION WEEK STUDIES

An Open Letter to Sunday School Teachers:

A new Sunday School year is soon to begin. Are you going to be a Minimum Teacher?

A Minimum Teacher is one who waits until Saturday night or Sunday morning to spend ten minutes with the Teacher's Quarterly and then considers himself prepared. A Minimum Teacher is one who thinks it unnecessary and unreasonable that he be able to pronounce Bible names. A Minimum Teacher is one who sees no connection between the lesson and the rest of the Bible and cannot effectively handle the pupils' questions. A Minimum Teacher is one who is bored by teaching and is himself a bore.

The Bible is too valuable to be treated so shabbily; the teaching of God's Word is far too important to be tossed off so carelessly. It deserves your best.

The only way you can be your best as a teacher is through study — and that means Books. The Quarterly is fine, but not enough. You need the thoughts of several different commentators, and there are many available. There is no excuse for mispronouncing Bible names if you have a Bible Dictionary at hand. The familiar harmonies of the gospels have now been joined by a Harmony of Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles and by a Harmony of the Life of Paul. There are Bible Handbooks and Concordances. There is a great world of information in your own family encyclopedia..

If you do not have and cannot afford such books, your Church Library has them. They are there just for your use and just for the taking.

You don't have time for all that? Then you don't have time to teach.
