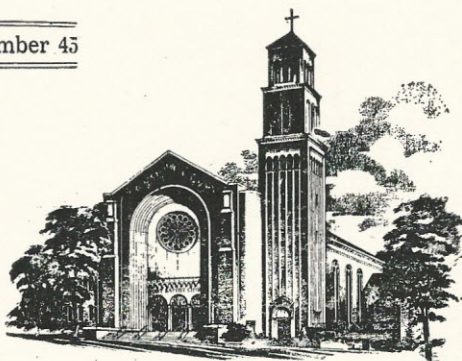

SOMETHING TO REMEMBER

"No man can break away from the church and its worship of God without feeling the effect of it in his own soul. If you see a man begin to serve the god of pleasure or money or fame, you will observe that very soon there begins a moral as well as a spiritual decline.

A CONTINUING CUBAN CRISIS

Because of the firm stand taken by the United States Government, the situation in Cuba is not nearly as critical as it was two weeks ago. Certainly we all realize



that the situation is still serious and we shall continue to pray for those in places of leadership. Our God is concerned about nations as well as individuals.

There is another Cuban crisis that deserves our prayerful concern. Since Castro came into power in Cuba, refugees have been leaving that country at the rate of 1600 per week. Most of these people are now living in Miami. There are more than 140,000 of them in this one city. They desperately need to get relocated in other parts of our country.

Southern Baptists have been challenged to have a part in this vital ministry. Thus far, we have been responsible for relocating some 27 families. If my figures are correct, this means it took about 30,000 Southern Baptists to relocate one Cuban family. I am afraid that most of us really have not given it any serious thought.

This is one needy mission project that we can all have a part in. The government will pay transportation cost of getting these people to Pensacola. We must assume the responsibility for providing housing, food, and a job. The key to the whole project is finding the job. Won't you please call the church office if you know where employment might be found for one of these needy families. I know such a ministry will be well pleasing to our Lord (Matthew 5:40).

Pictured above is the Royal Ambassador Emblem designed for the new enlarged Royal Ambassador organization which was initiated in October 1961.

The Irregular circular outline behind the Shield represents the Brotherhood, the sponsoring organization. The Shield which forms the background speaks of faith, and means that the boy is an Ambassador for Christ.

The components on the Shield are representative of the three Royal Ambassador programs. The Crown represents the Crusader program (ages 9 through 11). It is symbolic of Christ, "... the King that cometh in the name of the Lord." Luke 19:38 (For Crusaders only, the five points on the Crown represents the five parts of the R.A. pledge).

The wheel represents the Pioneer program (ages 12 through 14). The eight spokes are symbolic of the qualities referred to in II Peter 1:5-7 which formulate the Pioneer code.

The Lighted torch represents the Ambassador program (ages 15 through 17) and suggests that Ambassadors are to be "... the light of the world." (Matthew 5:14).
