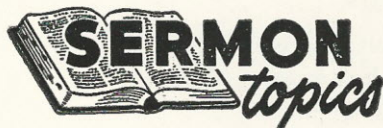

OUR TASK

In a recent sermon on "The Redemptive Fellowship" our pastor said:

"... The redemptive fellowship has not been seeking the redemption of others as we should. But our task does not end there. The work of the redemptive fellowship is not completed when we have won others to Jesus. We are to seek by every conceivable means of strengthen them in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We are to help these babes in Christ as they grow and mature. We must realize that we have a responsibility to these who come and profess their faith in Jesus, and we must never take the attitude that once they're reached we can wash our hands of them.
