The second alternative is to become resigned. He can just give in and compromise with the forces around him. Like a leaf on the water he can float along with the stream until he is finally submerged in it.

The third alternative is to re-sign. He can have his commission renewed and with God's help meet the challenge.

As I survey my own responsibility as pastor of this church, I recall my call from God and re-sign. These past four years have been wonderful years and I look with confidence to the blessings that Almighty God has in store for us in the future. Please remember that your pastor is totally dependent on your prayers and helpful support.
