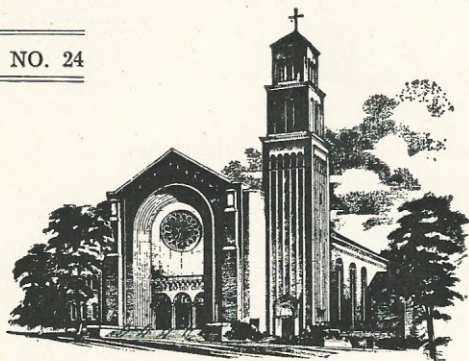

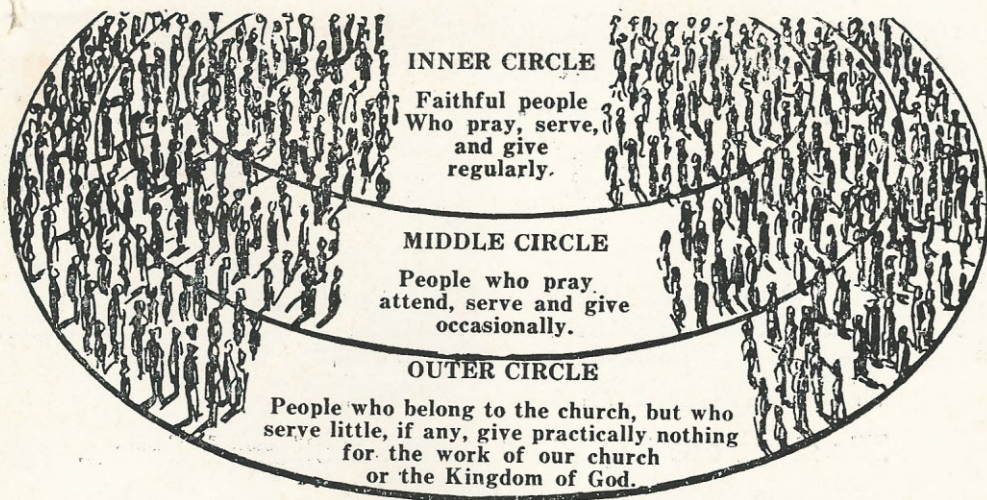

Since so many of you have asked about the trip. I thought perhaps you would like to know about some of the places we are scheduled to visit.

The plane is to fly from New York non-stop to Zurich, Switzerland. During the next several weeks we will visit Rome, Cairo, Memphis, Beirut, Damascus, Syria, Jerusalem (while in the Holy Land we will make extensive tours including Bethlehem, Hebron, Jericho, Bethany, Jordan, Dead Sea, Qumran ruins, Samaria, Jerash, Amman, Madeba, Mt. Nebo, etc.) Israel, Nazareth, Tiberias, Sea of Galilee, Tel Aviv, Athens, Daphni, Corinth, Istanbul, Turkey; Vienna, Austria; Moscow, Copenhagen, Berlin, Amsterdam, Paris, London, and back to New York.

I will never be able to thank you enough for the privilege of making this trip. I am most grateful to each one of you who has had a part in making it possible.

1. PURPOSE

We are pleased to present the long awaited new facility for recreation and church social activities. Your Church Recreation Committee has given serious thought and effort to the task of planning a program which we hope will benefit in a great way our endeavor to build Christian character and contribute the maximum to the welfare of the church.

We shall continuously try through enlistment, training, planning, and promoting to offer a properly balanced program which can unify and correlate the social life fostered by the various organizations. Our greatest aim will always be to give honor to Christ as we magnify and dignify social life in the minds of our people.

2. LEADERSHIP

- (1) The Church Recreation Committee
- (2) The Director of Youth Activities
- (3) The Assistant to the Pastor
- (4) The Youth Activities Committee
- (5) The Athletics Committee
- (6) The Boy Scouts' Committee

3. OBJECTIVES.

- (1) Provide a place for organizational parties and socials.
- (2) Provide and equip an area for informal recreation for all ages.
- (3) Promote church-wide tournaments and organized league activity.
- (4) Provide equipment for scheduled activities away from the church.
- (5) Give instruction in new or unfamiliar areas of recreation.
- (6) Seek out additional possibilities; develop and adapt them to our needs and aims.
- (7) Provide a Youth Center. A gathering place for our young people and their friends for reading, study, TV, and social-recreational activities.
- (8) To maintain a social-recreation calendar supporting the total church ministry as scheduled on the official church calendar.

4. PROGRAM AND PROCEDURES.

- (1) Regular periods for the Activities Center will be scheduled. All ages may participate.
- (2) A 'Sign-in' board will be utilized to help determine use-load and age-demand.
- (3) When regularly scheduled activities are not in session the area and/or equipment may be reserved by groups within the church.
- (4) The area and equipment will not be used except when Recreation Committeeman directly responsible for supervision or their appointees are present to check out equipment.
- (5) Broken and damaged equipment arising out of misuse or neglect will be replaced by the person responsible for the checked out equipment.

Only Pioneers and Ambassadors are eligible to attend. Boys or parents desiring additional information may feel free to call Mr. Bizzell at the church.



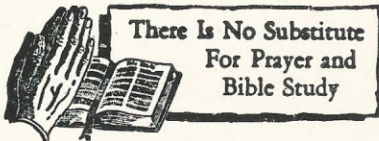
MEMORIAL FLOWERS
