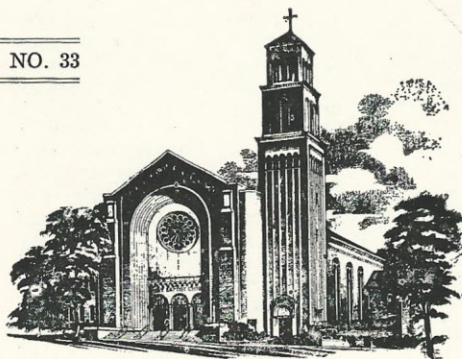

help hold him up . . .

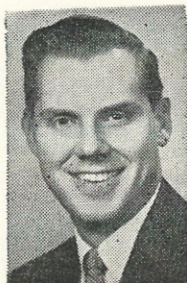
Let me lift his hands without placing

FIRST BAPTIST LOOKS FOR NEW MINISTER OF MUSIC!

That's right . . . not merely a single individual but scores of Christians who cheerfully and energetically serve through singing congregational hymns. What is the opinion of those worshipers seated near you concerning the manner in which you participate—not observe—in the service? New hymns, old hymns, childhood favorites, even those which do not particularly appeal to some of us who are chosen to aid in directing our mental and spiritual activity in corporate worship. We hope that the ENTERTAINMENT element can be eliminated from the areas of service planning. When a hymn is sung with no other motive in mind than "because we love to sing it" or "I grew up on that song" or "that song reminds me of . . ." we misdirect our efforts to encourage a worship experience and settle for personal entertainment. Isn't it a shame that we have removed personally engaging, active sort of participation in almost every facet of our lives as social creatures? We have yielded to the call to be spectators.

There's always help for us! Try this:

I. Use the hymnal for every congregational hymn. Whether you know it or not, pick up the hymnal and show concern and interest in its Message.

II. Don't be afraid to sing. Give full-voiced, deep conviction, sincere enthusiasm and earnest attention to the content and intent of the hymn.

III. Let your physical appearance be one of eager participation. Do not let comfort cheat you out of a blessing.

Dear people, may your fervor and joy be so contagious that no voice will be stilled from singing His praise. "What I have . . . I'll give Him . . . give my heart!"

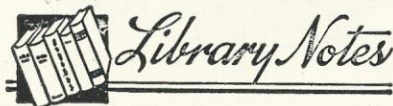

HOME MISSIONS IN PENSACOLA

Home Missions are closer than you think. In recent years Pensacola churches have benefitted from these ministries of the Board:

1. Religious Census (survey) of the entire county in February, 1961.
2. Goodwill Center workers provided this summer (1963).
3. Vacation Bible School workers provided in past years.
4. Seminary Extension Center operated for colored pastors and workers for past two years.
5. Bonds purchased from several local churches over a period of years.
6. Money for building provided as loans to several local churches.
7. Summer worker provided for Camp Ada in 1960.
8. Camp Missionary provided for Associational G. A. Camp in 1963.
9. Missionaries provided for Schools of Missions 1963, 1959, etc.
10. Worker with the deaf provided to begin work at Warrington in 1960, since transferred to Brownsville and conducted by local workers.
11. Baptist pastor screened by the Board before appointment as Military Chaplain, some from and others to Pensacola.
12. More than \$100.00 worth of filmstrips have been given by the Board to our Associational Filmstrip Library.
