

Pastor's Paragraphs

FREE GASOLINE TOMORROW

My good friend, Bill Pratt, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Greenville, Texas, recently quoted a good friend of



his in his pastor's paragraph. Although it comes to you third hand, I would like to share this thought with you.

"Outside a service station in a certain town is a sign which reads, 'Free Gasoline Tomorrow.' It shouldn't be necessary to underline a perfectly

obvious catch, yet somehow it is. Of course, nobody ever gets free gas at this station, because it is always promised tomorrow.

"In the realm of religion a notice that offers free petrol tomorrow is no good, nor is a religion that offers happiness tomorrow or power tomorrow; the recurring note in the New Testament is NOW!

"Our Lord puts the emphasis on NOW. Take your Bible and note this fact. Jesus said, 'Do you NOW believe?' (John 16:31). This He asked of those who had no past to look to, and no certainty of a future. The setting in which the Christian's life becomes operative in God's program is provided in that word . . . NOW. The Christian's great moment is NOW. 'Now is the accepted time, behold NOW is the day of Salvation.' (II Cor. 6:2). Paul's own witness is 'The life which I now live, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.' (Gal. 2:20). 'Beloved, now are we the sons of God.' (I John 3:2).

"The Divine Imperative for us, for our church, for our community, for you, for me, is Revival NOW. Why? God's Time Is Now!"



LIBRARY NOTES

The prevalent problem in this "age of Aspirin and Anxiety" is the lack of faith in God. In the every first chapter of Dr. Lofton Hudson's book "For Our Age of Anxiety," the author comes to grips with this problem as he plumbs the depths of meaning in the 23rd Psalm to bring understanding and comfort to the reader.

Of the 14 sermons in this volume, the following are typical: "On loving people you don't like," "So you want to be great," "Why do good people suffer?" "Is the Bible really the Word of God?" and "The mystery of death."

Dr. Hudson has a realistic view of evil and understands that the religious person faces more deceptive temptations than the irreligious. He has used the Bible as a magnifying glass to reveal tensions of Christian living in our time.
