READ THE N.T. IN 1964

The Sunday School and Training Union departments of the Baptist Sunday School Board are promoting the reading of the New Testament by every Southern Baptist, Intermediate and above, in 1964.

Dr. Albert McClellan, program planning secretary of the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention, explains, the origin of this plan:

"Read the New Testament through in one year—this is the challenge of the Baptist Jubilee Advance. It became a part of the program for 1964 when Dr. Porter Routh, the executive secretary of the Southern Baptist Convention Executive Committee pointed out that the modern missionary movement which was ignited by a personal knowledge of the Bible by thousands of earnest men and women who believed that the gospel of the Bible was good news for all the world. The power of the Bible can be felt only as people read it and study it. As the Jubilee year arrives let every man, woman and young person resolve to read the New Testament through, following the plan recommended by the Training Union and implemented in *The Bible Reader's Guide and Missionary Prayer Calendar*.

Vigorous promotion will be given to this plan throughout the Southern Baptist Convention in 1964. You are urged to resolve out of gratitude to God for His many blessings to join in this program for reading the New Testament through in 1964.

Those who follow the Bible Readers' Course in the Training Union materials will need to enlarge upon your reading in order to read the entire New Testament. The plan calls upon us to read Matthew and Mark in the first quarter, Luke and John in the second quarter, Acts through Galatians in the third quarter, and Ephesians through Revelation in the fourth quarter.

Bible Study Week

January 12-16

Dr. Russell Bradley Jones, widely known author and Bible teacher, will be our teacher for Bible Study Week January 12-16, Monday through Thursday.

Dr. Jones is Professor Emeritus of Bible at Carson-Newman College, Jefferson City, Tennessee, a former president of the Tennessee Baptist Convention, and has served as a member of the Education Commission and the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. He has held pastorates in Tennessee, Maryland, Georgia, and Manila, Philippine Islands.

Dr. Jones is the author of a number of widely read books including *A Survey of The Old and New Testaments*; *The Epistles of James, John and Jude*; *These Things Which Shall Be Hereafter*; *The Epistles to Timothy*; *Calvary Attitudes*; and *Gold From Golgotha*, which has sold over 40,000 copies.
