BECAUSE OF YOUR FAITHFULNESS we will be able to pay several thousand dollars more on our church debt than we had anticipated.

This marvelous record is possible because we have hundreds of people who are willing to follow God's plan of financing the work of the kingdom. You are the people who faithfully bring God's tithe into His storehouse week after week in obedience to what the Bible teaches. You good folk know the joy that comes in doing God's will. Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." This verse can also be read, "It makes one happier to give than to get."

The word is defined by Mr. Webster as "a plant or animal living on some other organism at whose expense it obtains food, shelter, etc." These words describe the parasite.
