Physically frail, but spiritually indomitable, Mary Slessor went alone among natives whose tribal rituals called for human sacrifice, who waged almost constant war among themselves and were hostile to white intruders. Through her faith and understanding, she won their trust and affection. When she died in 1915, Mary Slessor was almost as pow-

## "M" NIGHT SPEAKER



**DR. K. OWEN WHITE**

Dr. K. Owen White, immediate past president of the Southern Baptist Convention, will be the speaker for the Associational Training Union "M" Night which will be held in our church Monday Evening, December 7.

Dr. White was born in London, England, spent his childhood in Canada, and came to the U.S. at the age of 19 and enrolled in the Bible Institute of Los Angeles. He is also a graduate of the University of Louisville, and did his theological work at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, earning the Th.M and Ph.D. degrees. He has served as pastor in Atlanta, Ga.; Little Rock, Arkansas; and Washington, D. C. before going, in 1954, to his present pastorate at First Baptist Church, Houston.

Active in denominational life, Dr. White served as President of the Southern Baptist Convention in 1963. He has also served as President of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.

He wrote the January Bible study book for 1958; and "Nehemiah Speaks Again" published by Broadman Press in 1964.

Music will be by the Youth Choir of the First Baptist Church, Pensacola, under the direction of Jerry Howell.
