

U. S. Judges Go To Jail

The headline of the article immediately caught my eye. As a rule judges send people to jail, they don't go there.



A few weeks ago 34 federal judges went behind the walls of the U.S. penitentiary in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania. These men went to jail not because they had committed any crime but because they wanted to find out personally what happens to a man when he is sent to prison.

Each judge was paired off with a prisoner for lunch. They spent the day touring the institution. They saw the spacious library with 20,000 books. They saw the scoreboard that read "Visitors and Feds."

The judges walked through the prison gates at 9:30 a.m. They left late the same afternoon.

In a sense this is the story of Christmas. Two thousand years ago ONE left the happiness and security of heaven to come and live with sinful mankind. He stayed not one day, but 33 years. When night came He did not leave the prison and return to the Father's House, He stayed on and willingly suffered for our transgressions. Prior to His birth the angel said: "You shall call his name Jesus, for He shall save his people from their sins."

Thank God for this gift of Jesus to the world.

Let us make very sure that on His birthday we honor Him in every way.

READ DEUTERONOMY IN JANUARY

Many of our people have been reading the New Testament during 1964. Those who have kept up with the assignments week by week have completed reading through the New Testament during the year.

May we suggest that you begin the new year by beginning to read the book of Deuteronomy. There are 34 chapters in the book. If you will read 1 chapter each day and 3 chapters on Sunday you will have completed the reading prior to our study to begin January 24.

By the way, copies of the textbook Studies in Deuteronomy are already available from the Church Office. This will be the textbook for our evening studies. In the morning sessions, Dr. Garland will be teaching the book of Amos.



CHURCH VOTES TO PURCHASE ORGAN

In a special business session called for the purpose of discussing the possibility of purchasing a new organ for the Sanctuary, members of the congregation unanimously and enthusiastically approved a recommendation of the Music, Finance Committee and the Deacons that we purchase a new organ for the Sanctuary.

Members of the various committees had been studying this matter for some months as it had become apparent that it was impossible to keep the old organ in playing condition.

It will take approximately 20 months to get this organ built and installed.

The organ will be built by the Reuter Organ Company, Lawrence, Kansas, and will consist of 5 divisions utilizing 51 complete ranks of pipes. More than 3000 pipes will be used.

The action of the church provided for financing the purchase from Debt Pre-Payment Funds now on hand and those funds which will accumulate during this period. Also, the congregation approved the borrowing of such funds as may be necessary at the time needed.

Copies of the information sheets with details regarding the price, method of financing, etc. which were passed out at the meeting are available from the Church Office.
