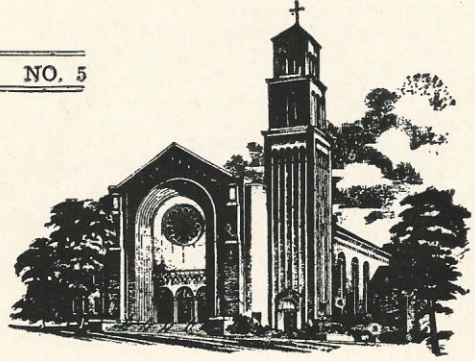

## AN OPEN LETTER TO A THEATRE MANAGER

The ads in the paper have been too large and too numerous to be overlooked. "By overwhelming demand" your theatre will continue to show SEX AND THE SINGLE GIRL for a "second" big week. I could wish that the decent people in this city had demanded that the showings be discontinued immediately.

How tragic it is when sex is exploited in such a sickening way. Many of the movies being shown, not only in your theatre but in most of them in the city, degrade that which God intended to be a thing of supreme beauty.

It is hard for me to conceive of Christian people seeing this type of picture. I would like to think that every born-again Christian belonging to the First Baptist Church has avoided your theatre like a plague during this showing, for you see, sir, this is what it is—a plague. It may be that you do not see the end results of such a picture, but I do. This is why I feel compelled to write you this letter.

In recent months the citizens of our community have shown great concern about the purity of our water supply. At the same time the pollution of the heart and mind continues at an unprecedented rate. It has well been said, "We are not what we think we are, but what we think—we are!" Jesus said, "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." Surely we are not foolish enough to suppose there is no relationship between such movies as the one being currently shown in your theatre and the astounding increase in all types of immorality and sex crimes.

Frankly, sir, the moral decay of our nation from within gives me greater concern than the threat of communism from without. If history teaches any lesson, it is this lesson. It may well be that in its greed for bigger box office receipts, the movie industry will ultimately destroy itself.

The motion picture industry can be used as a great force for good. I for one would like to plead for something wholesome and clean.

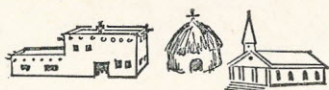

## Baptist World Alliance

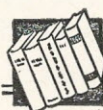
### BAPTIST WORLD CONGRESS

CMDR. GEORGE HAMILTON

Commander Hamilton is a veteran of 29 years of Naval Service. He entered the Navy as an Apprentice Seaman and has risen through the ranks to the grade of Commander.

In World War II he was an enlisted pilot in the Pacific. He served 2 tours in Korea in charge of helicopter rescue detachments. During his second tour in Korea, he was stationed at the United Nations Peace Camp where the negotiations for the repatriation of American prisoners took place.

His combat decorations include the Distinguished Flying Cross, Presidential Unit Citation and the Navy Unit Commendation.

Cdr. Hamilton has traveled extensively throughout the United States as a public speaker for the Navy and in 1958 he was awarded the Navy Commendation Medal for his contribution to the creation of a better understanding between the Navy and the general public.

He is presently assigned to the staff of the Chief of Naval Air Training as a Special Projects Officer.

Let's Go To Church On Sunday Nights

Let's go to church Sunday nights. You used to, before TV. Are you willing to cancel out the values of the Sunday evening church activities and the value of your own influence on others because of a TV program or two? If so, your Christianity has lost some of its zing.

Let's go to church on Sunday nights. You used to, before you acquired this circle of unchurched friends who have had more influence over you than you have had over them. Surely you aren't willing to cancel the influence of Sunday night church services in favor of a little social circle that is unwilling to use six other nights for secular fellowship.

Let's go to church on Sunday nights. You used to, when friendships made on the basis of the common Lordship of Christ were the friendships dearest to you. Do you think it would be well if we turned out the lights and joined the host of churches that have found it necessary to cut the Lord's Day in half?

Let's go to church on Sunday nights. Our fathers did. Old ministers used to announce that services would begin "at lamp lighting time." Their religious devotions grew the moral fiber that largely made our culture what it is. Is yours as strong as theirs? Will the future be as strong? Your children's world, for instance?

Let's go to church on Sunday nights. Jesus did. It was in the Upper Room at eventide, on the first day of the week, that our Lord appeared after the Emmaus travelers reported His being "made known to them in the breaking of bread." In fact, our custom of first day of the week (Lord's Day) worship began with Sunday night services during Jesus' post-resurrection appearances.

Let's all begin attending church on Sunday nights.
