

## CHURCH BURGLARIZED

The only things of any REAL value that I keep here in the office are a rock from the Sea of Galilee and two miniature Razorback Hogs. One of our ladies in the office said, "At last you will have a chance to clean up your desk." (What did she mean by this?)

I almost feel sorry for the burglars. They must have spent hours chiselling their way into the little office safe. Imagine their disappointment in finding it empty. Invariably this is the case unless you are looking for church records.

Believe it or not, I am more concerned about the burglars in the church than I am the burglars out of it. This may be a harsh word to use but it is biblical (Malachi 3:8): "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings." When I spend God's money on self it is a crime.

In the case of the persons responsible for robbing our safe Sunday night, in all probability they make no pretense of being Christians. On the other hand, God's tithes and offerings are taken by those who claim to be Christians.

The police may never apprehend the people responsible for burglarizing the church office but rest assured, God always gets His man!

I will look forward to seeing you Sunday. In one hand I will be carrying my Bible—in the other, God's tithe plus an offering to be used for His work. See you then.
