

Aubrey Hearn and "Alcohol and Christian Responsibility" by Earle are also very revealing and helpful to a full understanding of this important subject.

The following paragraphs were taken from a recent bulletin of the First Baptist Church of Muskogee, Oklahoma. They relate so clearly how easy it is to let those about us know that we have a loving concern for their spiritual welfare.

"It started in a grocery store. I was standing in the check-out line when this lady made a remark about the beautiful tomatoes in my grocery basket. Soon, we had quite a conversation going about the difficulty of finding nice vegetables this time of the year; the price of groceries, and so on. I introduced myself finally, and then on an impulse I asked, 'Where do you attend church?' Imagine my surprise when I found out she went no where regularly and had a husband and three children at home. I told her how much our church meant to me . . . how I knew she, her husband, and the children would also love it, and then asked if I might call on her at home soon and visit with her more.

"I turned the information about the family of prospects into the church office, and now they are actively being sought after by several teachers and interested persons. I am sure they will attend and be won to Christ soon."

First Baptist members need to do what this woman did . . . take advantage of each opportunity to try to enlist others for Christ and His church.
