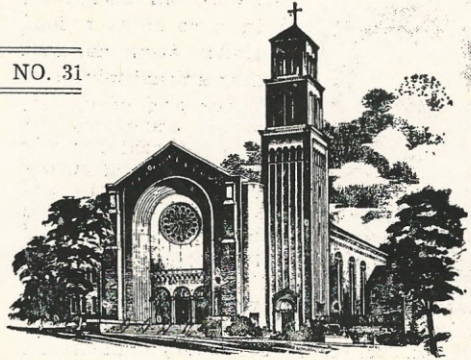

There will be NO meeting of the Brotherhood next Monday, August 9.

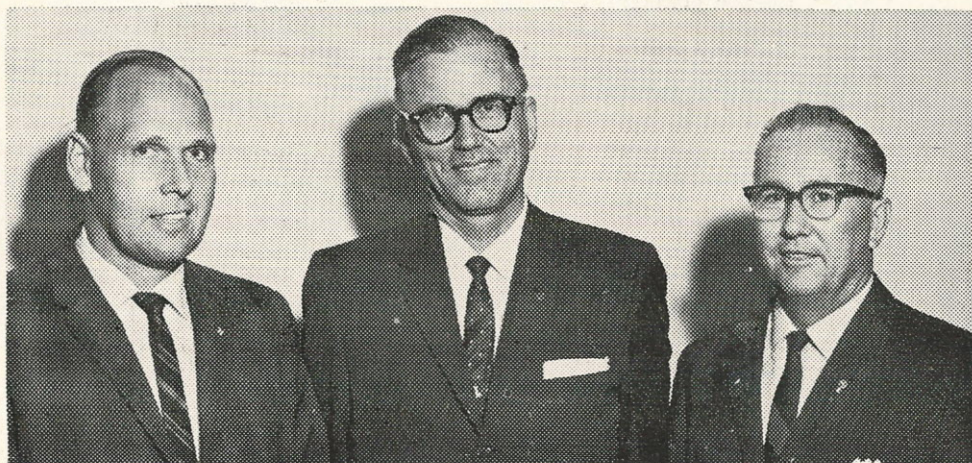
The Deacons will meet at the usual hour of 7:30 p.m. Be listening for other plans concerning our Brotherhood.
