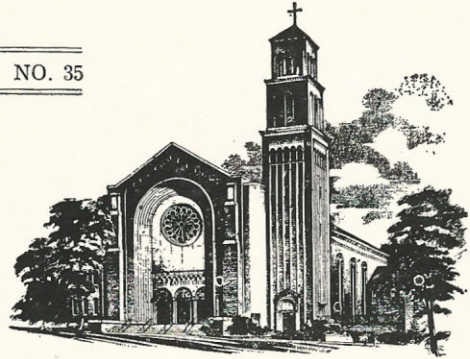

## OPERATION "HEART START"

A great deal has been written recently about Operation 'Head Start'. As you know this is one of the controversial new anti-poverty programs being sponsored by our government. Thus far in Florida some four million dollars has been spent in giving pre-school training to about 25,000 youngsters this summer.

I do not feel that I am in a position to analyze Operation 'Head Start'. The one man I have talked to about the program who is in a position to know, tells me it can be a wonderful thing.

There is another operation that I am vitally concerned about — Operation "Heart Start". We have a lot of people who belong to the church who need additional attention as we start our fall program. These folks are not necessarily mentally retarded nor are they maliciously mean, it is just that they have a hard time appraising what is really important in life. (They don't have too much difficulty deciding between the good and the bad, it is trying to decide between the good and the best that is so confusing!)

For the past three months some of our members have all but dropped out of church for one reason or another. Boats (with sails and motors), swimming meets, golf matches and just goofing off in general have taken a heavy toll.

As your pastor I am counting on the hundreds of dedicated workers in this congregation to go all out in making Operation 'Heart-Start' a success. Do your very best to contact your absentees before Sunday.
