Every line of the budget spells out "people". It also spells out "need" and "love".

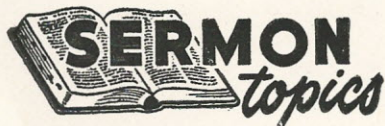
At the heart of our budget is Christ. If Christ had not changed our hearts when we trusted Him, few of us would be inclined to give much to support the work of the church.

The purpose of this book is not to show you how to make money, nor necessarily how to save it. The real objective is skill in the use of money.

In YOUR GOD AND YOUR GOLD, Leslie B. Flynn, you will find chapter headings such as: Money talks — But what does it say?; God made the decimal point; Can you justify your expense account?; Yellow Fever; When money turns mute; Where will your money spend eternity?

Stewardship and giving are similar; but they are not synonymous says Robert Hastings in his book MY MONEY AND GOD. With a brisk, lively touch he defines total stewardship as encompassing all of life — personality and influence as well as money.

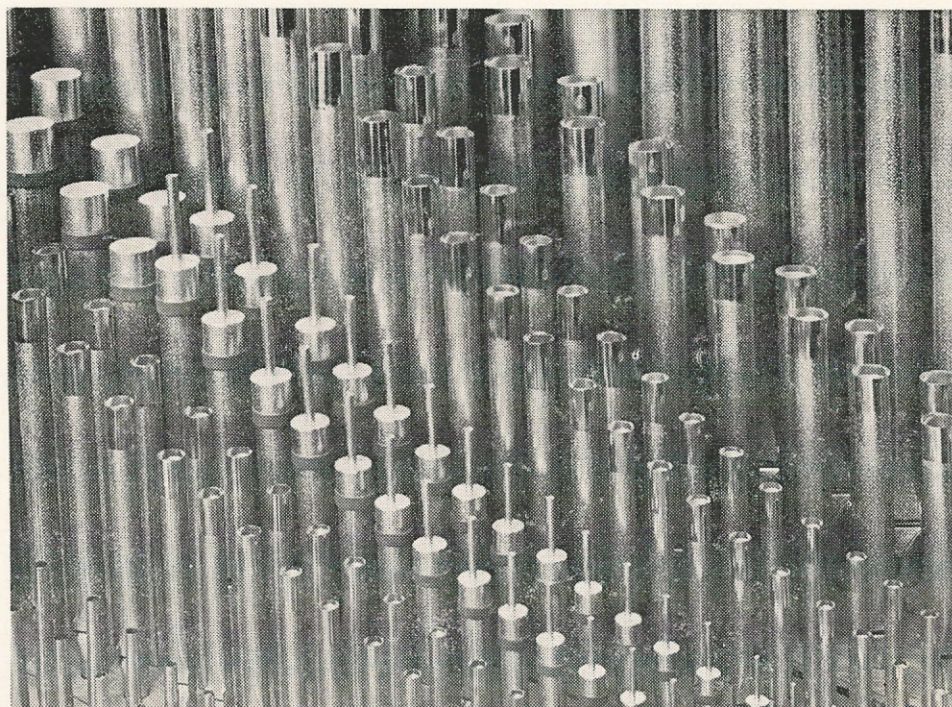
