

CLIFF BARROWS PREACHES SUNDAY MORNING

Cliff Barrows, Director of Music for the Billy Graham Evangelistic Team, will preach for us at the 11:00 a.m. service next Sunday. Cliff is a native Californian, born in Ceres, California. He was converted and ordained to the ministry at the First Baptist Church of Ceres. He served as Assistant Pastor of the Temple Baptist Church, St. Paul, Minnesota. During college days, he travelled as Jack Shuler's Song Leader. He met Billy Graham at a Youth for Christ Rally in 1944. The next year when Cliff and his wife were on their honeymoon, they attended a Youth for Christ Rally where Billy Graham was preaching. When the scheduled Song Leader failed to arrive, Cliff was drafted. From this meeting the Billy Graham Evangelistic Team was formed.

Cliff has the responsibilities for directing the entire service in Crusades and on "The Hour of Decision."

He now resides in Greenville, South Carolina, with his wife, Billie, and their five children.

Library Notes

National Library Week is April 15-23 this year. The theme is "Explore Inner Space — READ." This is a significant theme. We have many books in the Church Library which would help to promote Christian growth, aid in preparation for all phases of church work and stimulate Christian living. One book, titled CONQUERING INNER SPACE, by John W. Steen, is especially recommended. He says "As a Christian realizes the great need for a thrust forward in his spiritual progress he sees the need to explore inner space. He can begin individually to discover his inner resources and his own originality. Upon finding this latent power in his life, he can channel that power into constructive use. These brief studies indicate the adjustments we can make to the pressures and anxieties of the space age."


