DR. PAUL GEREN TO PREACH SUNDAY

It's Time!

Here is a reprint from a UPI news release regarding the change of our time:

"Under the 1966 uniform time law, enacted to bring order into the chaotic observance of daylight saving time, clocks must stay an hour ahead, from the last Sunday in April to the last Sunday in October, in every state except where the legislature specifically acted to keep the state on standard time."

This means that as of Saturday, October 28, we will see Eastern Daylight Saving Time bow out. At 12:01 A.M. on Sunday, October 29, clocks will be set back an hour to 11:01.

This means that every member of Sunday School can be ON TIME Sunday!

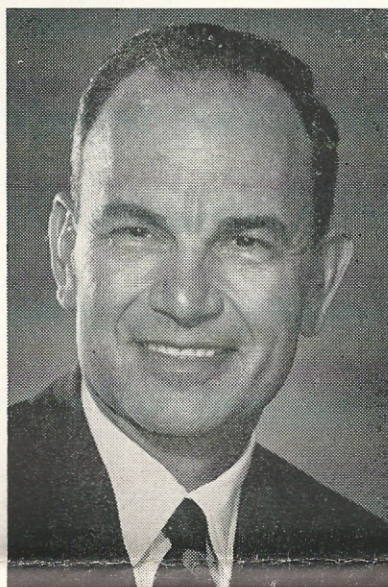

Dr. Paul Geren, President of Stetson University, DeLand, Fla. will be our visiting preacher for both services on next Sunday. Dr. Geren assumed his new duties at Stetson on September 15. He is a native of El Dorado, Arkansas, a graduate of Baylor University. He has earned a Masters Degree both from Louisiana State University and Harvard University. He has earned a Doctor's Degree from Harvard.

He has served as a college professor in India, in Pakistan and here in the U.S. He entered foreign service of the U.S. in 1947 and has served in India, in Syria, in Jordan, in Africa, and at the time of his election to the Presidency of Stetson he was serving as Counselor for economic affairs in Tripoli, Libya. He served as Executive vice-president of Baylor University. He served as Deputy-director of the U.S. Peace Corps.

Dr. Geren is the son of a Baptist minister and has been active in Baptist Denominational work. He and his family are active members of the First Baptist Church DeLand, Florida. Dr. and Mrs. Geren have three daughters: Natasha, 20, a student at Duke University; Juliana, 18, a student at Smith College; and Nancy, 15, a student at DeLand High School.

Dr. Geren served as a volunteer ambulance driver with the Chinese army in Burma. He escaped from Burma in the Stilwell March, he served as a combat medic in the Medical Unit formed by Dr. Gordon Seagraves and won a direct commission as an intelligence officer after serving behind Japanese lines with the famed Merrill's Marauders. He is the author of "Burma Diary," published by Harper in 1943.

A WORD FROM EAST AFRICA

Greetings from East Africa. God continues to bless in the revival. The number of converts continues to mount. "To God be the glory — great things He hath done!"



I am now working in revivals in the Arusha area. We have a fine seminary located here in the mountains of Tanzania. The seminary is located on the slope of Mount Maru. Kilimanjaro is just a few miles away.

There are 42 African students here at the seminary. I preached to them in a chapel service yesterday and will speak again today. These dedicated young men are doing a great work for our Lord. Most of them are now pastoring churches in the area.

Beginning Sunday I will be working with the Masai Tribe. Since no one here at the seminary can speak Masai, a fine Lutheran layman has agreed to translate for me. His name is Andrew Paul. How do you like that for a Bible name!

Many of the Christians here in East Africa have biblical names. At the time of their conversion many of them change their name. Would you believe that I have met Moses? And Jeremiah? and Zaccheus? Not to speak of numerous Daniels and Pauls! Names are not all that are being changed in East Africa. Lives are being changed too. The Bible says, "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature. Old things are passed away, all things are become new." Thank God!

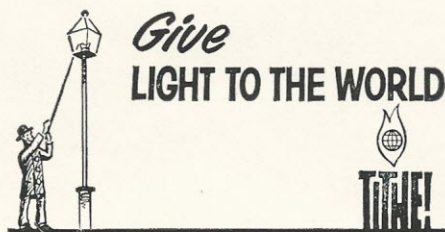


SENIOR ADULT FELLOWSHIP

5. It will be a memento of your church and your Christian friends that you will treasure in years to come.

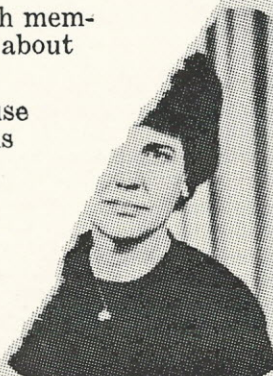
What it will mean to you: you will have a current up-to-date directory at no cost.

6. Do not make but one appointment.



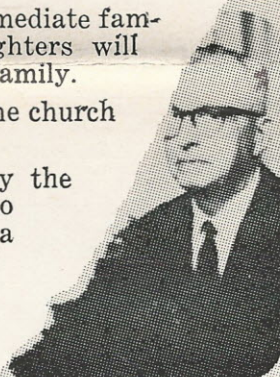

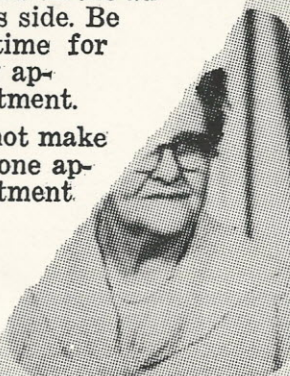
