

Pastor's Paragraphs

SHARE YOUR FAITH

I am still singing the Doxology over our victory of last Sunday. For the first time ever we oversubscribed our budget



in one day. This came as no surprise to me. I KNEW you would do it.

Now we can all turn our energies over to the most important matter — the winning of men and women to Jesus Christ. If we are going to reach them, we must give of ourselves.

Dr. Walter Shurden has written an excellent article. There is a lot of truth in what he says.

"I BELIEVE . . ."

"When I was a teen-ager and ready to make a try at getting my first job, I started calling employers on the telephone, asking if they had a job opening. When he heard how I was going about it, Daddy said to me, 'Son, when you have something as important as a job to talk to someone about, go see them in person; make him know you are interested enough to make a personal visit.' There is a lot of wisdom packed into Dad's advice — wisdom our church needs at this juncture of our ministry. Write it in bold black letters, underline it in bright, bright red, and plaster it all over your Christian conscience — CHRISTIANITY MUST BE SHARED PERSONALLY. The church has never improved upon Jesus' strategy of sending one man out to invite another man in. A mimeographed letter won't do it! A postcard won't do it. Neither will a poster in the church hall, nor a public announcement from the pulpit, or a sign out in front of the church! Hear the roll call: the Jesuits, the Salvation Army, the Mormons, the Jehovah Witnesses. What do they have in common that would cause one to lump them together. Background? Organizational structure? Theology? Of course not! Except for one thing, they are as different as religious groups can possibly be. Their similarity is their militant commitment to what they believe and their stubborn persistence in personally sharing that belief.

"Sunday School teacher, Discussion Leader, Departmental Superintendent, Pastor, Christians of First Church — if we really have something important to say to people about Jesus Christ, we're going

We have received a number of BEGINNING SCIENCE BOOKS. There is one on SQUIRRELS by John Feilen.

Town children know the gray squirrel, and country children know the red squirrel. The life stories of both of these saucy animals are told in detail. The book also includes information about many other squirrels of North America including ground squirrels and flying squirrels. This is illustrated in full color.

WATER by Philip B. Carona is another BEGINNING SCIENCE BOOK.

"You drink it. You wash with it. You use it for cooking and heating. Plants won't grow without it. Too much of it will kill you. Three quarters of the earth is covered with it! Young readers will learn all about the influence water has on our lives in this simply written, beautifully illustrated book.

DEER by John Feilen is a BEGINNING SCIENCE BOOK.

Following the white-tailed deer through the seasons, the young reader learns how these graceful animals live and care for their young. Moose, caribou, elk, and many interesting deer from other continents are also described and shown in full-color illustrations.
