

Pastor's Paragraphs

ON CHANGING NAMES

It happens every once in a while. Someone will get dissatisfied with his name and decide to change it. Take the movie



star, Tony Curtis, for instance. His name was Bernie Schwartz but he changed it. (What he really needs to change is his way of living!)

For years we have called it **The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for Foreign Missions** — and this is as it should be. Miss Lottie was a wonderful woman. For 39 years

she gave her all to Christ. While in China she constantly wrote back to America begging for additional missionaries. As a result of her pleas, the Christmas offering for foreign missions was taken. Enough money was given to send three missionaries to the field. Since then a large portion of our total Foreign Mission budget has been given through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. The goal for 1967 is \$15,000.00. The goal for our church is \$16,000.00.

Far be it from me to take anything away from Miss Moon, but this year when I make my love gift I will be thinking of some modern-day Lottie Moons who serve in distant lands.

.... Mrs. James Hampton is a modern-day Lottie Moon. She carries the same load any busy housewife carries but she still finds time to serve as a missionary. You will find her busy teaching classes at the seminary — directing the seminary choir — and assisting her husband in working in the many churches in the Arusha area of Tanzania. If necessary, she can drive a Land Rover as well as any white hunter.

.... Mrs. Dave Saunders is another modern-day Lottie Moon. She, too, is a busy housewife and mother but she is as much a Lottie Moon as the original. You will find her busy day and night taking care of the physical needs of the seminary faculty and student body. Mrs. Saunders is the total medical staff serving our seminary in Arusha. Once a week she conducts a clinic in one of the smaller churches of the area. Two weeks ago she treated 125 patients in one day. Nor is this all — she is just as concerned, if not more so, about the spiritual needs of the African people.

In a sense Lottie Moon is very much alive to-day. The plea is still for funds. I hope and pray that each one of us will
