



Pastor's Paragraphs

WE TRY HARDER

It is high on the agenda every time the Southern Baptist Executive Committee meets. We have wrestled with the problem for several years. This year was no exception. Shall we or shall we not change our name?

Many people are saying we need to change our name. Some convincing arguments are advanced for changing the name of our Convention from Southern Baptist to any one of fifty different names. At least forty have been seriously considered.

There is a lot involved in changing the name of our Convention. There are all sorts of legal involvements and it would cost thousands and thousands of dollars.

The Executive Committee has suggested 25 criteria by which to evaluate any proposed new names. Here are just a few: Is its meaning clear? Is it easy to spell? Does it look good? Is it easy to remember? Does it have a pleasant sound? (Would you believe I have applied these criteria to MY name and decided to change it! I ask you, is "Pleitz" easy to spell? Does it look good? Is it pleasant sounding? Is it easy to remember? What would you suggest I change my name to?)

When the Southern Baptist Convention meets in Houston, the messengers will vote on three proposed names. Regardless of the outcome of this vote, our name may or may not be changed but at least we will have an indication as to how people feel about the proposed change.

Three names will appear on the ballot: The United Baptist Convention, The Baptist General Convention, and The Southern Baptist Convention.

Dr. Porter Routh suggested another one that I like best of all, "The American Baptist Convention No. 2 — We Try Harder." There is already an American Baptist Convention but the "No. 2 — We Try Harder" added to the name would make us distinct. I like it.

You know, my friend, the thing we need to do as Baptists, whether we are General Baptists, or United Baptists, or just plain old Southern Baptists, is roll up our sleeves and go to work for Christ. Some of us have been resting since early fall. How about you? Isn't it about time you reported back to work?

The good Lord willing I'll see you Sunday.

who is a consultant, general Sunday School administration unit, field services section, Sunday School department, Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, Nashville, will be the visiting director for Sunday School Enlargement Campaign, March 10-14.

A native of Louisiana, White is a bachelor of arts graduate of Louisiana College, Pineville, and received his master of theology and doctor of theology degrees from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville.

Before joining the staff of the Board's Sunday School department in June 1964, White was pastor for three years of Temple Baptist Church, Hattiesburg, Mississippi. Previously, he was pastor for four years of First Baptist Church in Natchez, Mississippi, and served as president of board of trustees of Jefferson Davis Memorial Hospital while there. He also served as member of the state executive board and of the executive committee of the Mississippi Baptist Convention.

White was pastor of First Baptist Church, Denham Springs, Louisiana, for over seven years. He also held pastorates in Indiana and Kentucky and served as president of Louisianas district 7 convention.

Dr. White will lead us to study our Sunday School possibilities, organization, etc. We will use the study course book, **Reaching All Prospects for the Church** as a guidebook. We will meet each evening Monday-Thursday, March 10-14.
