

BEWARE, BAD DOG.

Some signs just naturally have a tendency to slow me down. Regardless of how fast I am driving, this sign always

slows me down: "Speed Radar Checked."

Then there is another sign. This one always stops me dead in my tracks: "Beware, Bad Dog."

We encountered such a sign this past Friday. There were some folk living in the house who had recently visited our church, but between us and the house there was a high fence and according to the sign, a bad dog.

After standing there at the fence for several minutes, the man of the house came out and in his arms he was carrying the bad dog. The dog was a Pekingese and must have weighed at least ten pounds. Like the sign said, he was bad. That dog nearly licked all the skin off my hand!

Paul encountered a lot of bad dogs in his life. He stared them right in the face and came to the conclusion that the fearful things he encountered in life were not nearly as frightening as he first thought. Paul came to this conclusion AFTER his encounter with Christ. Christ made (and still makes) all the difference.

Listen. "Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Can trouble, pain or persecution? Can lack of clothes and food, danger to life and limb, the threat of force of arms? No, in all these things we win an overwhelming victory through him who proved his love for us. I have become absolutely convinced that neither death nor life, neither messenger of Heaven nor monarch of earth, neither what may happen tomorrow, neither a power from on high nor a power from below, nor anything else in God's whole world has any power to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord!"
