



LIBRARY NOTES

"Sea so big, ship so small" was written by Jeanne Bendick with young people in mind. This book can be read with profit—and with pleasure—by anyone of any age who has ever stepped into a boat, large or small, or ever intends to do so.

The author-artist lets her facts and her pictures tell the story. She pulls no punches. She makes it clear that when you're handling a boat, you either think or sink, but she manages to convey her information so palatably that it's interesting even to those who never go near the water.

The information ranges from hints on how to buy the best boat to careful instructions on rescue breathing, caring for your boat, how the motor works, how to make knots, how to dock, weather, currents, navigation aids, first aid, what to do in an accident, and what makes accidents, rules of the road, and so on.

Pastor's Paragraphs

ON HAVING A SEASON TICKET

It is enough to cause a fellow's blood pressure to rise. Think of it — I have a season ticket which entitles me to see every game played by the Chicago White Sox!

It is all very official. My number is 4173, and look — my ticket is signed by the president of the Club.

Now I wouldn't want you to think that the president of the ball club is a personal friend of mine, and that he gave me this ticket. The ticket was given to me by a dear friend, Sumner Wemp, who served as pastor of the Central Baptist Church.

Now I ask you, can you think of a more generous gesture on the part of a preacher. It is enough to choke a fellow up. There is just one small problem. My ticket (which is number 4173 and signed by the president) is for the year 1967 and it just occurred to me that this is the year 1968. Even a ticket signed by the president is worthless if the games were played last year.

Some folk I know seem to think God's promises are like my 1967 baseball ticket. They were good in the past, but . . .

Take this promise God made some 600 years before the birth of Christ: "Call upon me and I will show you great and mighty things." Friend, that promise is good today. Claim it!

Or the promise found in Hebrews 13:5, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee . . ." That promise is good today. Claim it!

Or take the promise Jesus made one night some two thousand years ago. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." That promise is good today too, and it is yours for the claiming.
