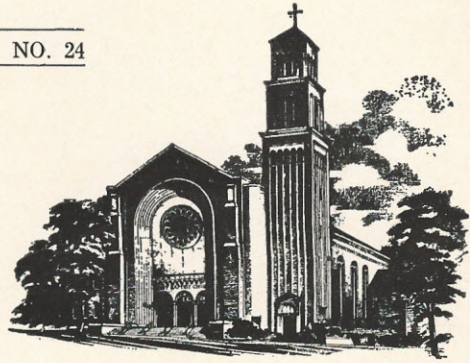

THREE FIRE TRUCKS AND THE INCENDIARY FELLOWSHIP

Several folk made mention of the hot sermon of the morning—but I really had not anticipated this reaction.

Just as our service ended Sunday night, three fire trucks came charging up Palafox hill. I stood on the church steps wondering where they were going. To my great surprise, they came to a screeching halt directly in front of the church.

For years we have been seeking to develop what Dr. Elton Trueblood calls "An Incendiary Fellowship." What better proof could you ask for than that three fire trucks parked directly in front of the Meeting House!

In a matter of minutes a sizable crowd had gathered in front of the church.

There are few things that will draw people like witnessing a fire from without. I would to God that we could develop such an interest among our people as far as the church gathered is concerned. Surely every member of the congregation including those who never — but never — come, would come IF the church were on fire.

... And then again — can you conceive of anything that will scatter folk as fast as a fire when it is being witnessed from within. Had the fire trucks arrived ten minutes earlier, we could have had a serious problem on our hands. When people find themselves in a burning building, there is a headlong rush to get out immediately — if not sooner.

May God hasten the day when we are as anxious to get out into the world and put into practice the teachings of Jesus (the church scattered) as men are to get out of a burning building.

God is concerned that as a church we scatter out in the community and that we as individuals stay busy doing the things Jesus would do if He were here. BUT, the church scattered can never be any stronger than the church gathered. I vote for Christ and the church, how about you? Your presence or absence Sunday will be your vote.

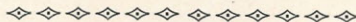
MEMORIAL FLOWERS
