Sunday Is Demonstration Day

1968 Budget Adopted

Our 1969 Budget, totaling \$349,-778.00, was adopted by the Congregation last Sunday. Prior to this formal vote, the Congregation had had opportunity to study the proposed budget and to discuss it in a special business session.

Mr. T. A. Shell, Chairman of the Deacons, pointed out Sunday morning that this budget reflects an increase in our mission giving of approximately \$40,000.

In adopting this budget, we have challenged ourselves to the largest Budget in the history of our church and to underwrite it in one day, November 17th.

As you look toward November 17, you will want to be thinking of your part, not so much in terms of what is MY share of the budget, but rather in terms of what is GOD's share of what I have.

Sunday is the date that has been set for our Demonstration Day. On this Sunday, members of First Baptist Church will make a MEANINGFUL DEMONSTRATION of our love for Christ and our love for our church. Every member is urged to bring on next Sunday a tithe of his weekly earnings. Many of our people who are already tithing regularly are planning to bring an over-and-above love offering.

Demonstration Day has been an outstanding day in the life of our church. Let's again DEMONSTRATE concerning our love!

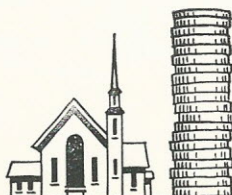
SEND IT ON AHEAD
