3. **Generate** a spirit of enthusiasm and good fellowship. The friendly and expectant atmosphere of a group is the perfect springboard for a good lesson.
4. **Cooperate** with your teacher when he wants to use new methods and techniques of instruction. Practice the Golden Rule.
5. **Stimulate** your teacher to new heights of effectiveness by paying close attention and looking interested. Your attitude can make a good teacher better. Teachers are inspired by an inspired countenance.
6. **Participate** in class discussions or other type of group activity. Your responsibility is to give as well as receive.
7. **Appreciate** the man hours of study and preparation your teacher gives to each week's lesson. Tell him how much the lessons mean to you. Write him a note of gratitude occasionally.
8. **Translate** the truths you learn on Sunday to your weekday life. This is the highest compliment you can pay your teacher.
