Wise Men and Fools

It's official now. David, the songster king, said as much three thousand years ago — but we were reluctant to believe him. Now Dr. George Gallup has confirmed David's findings in a recently conducted poll. **THE SMART MAN REALIZES HIS NEED FOR GOD.**

The Gallup Poll indicates that church attendance for 1968 dropped two per cent from 1967. A measly thirty-eight per cent of the Protestants in America attended church regularly. (Something desperately needs to be done to make membership and discipleship **SYNONYMOUS**. For nearly two out of three of our members, there seems to be no relationship between the two.)

NOW HEAR THIS. THE HIGHER THE EDUCATIONAL LEVEL OF THE ADULT, THE GREATER THE PROBABILITY HE WILL BE IN CHURCH ON SUNDAY. College graduates lead the country in church attendance. Contrast the wise man with the fool. Remember David said three thousand years ago: "The fool hath said in his heart there is no God." His name may be on the church roll, but by his actions the fool says there is no God. Why worship a God who doesn't even exist?

THE WISE MAN IS IN CHURCH ON SUNDAY because he realizes his own need for God. He is smart enough to know that man cannot live by bread alone. He is smart enough to know that there are not enough "things" in this world to satisfy the deep longing of his heart.

THE WISE MAN IS IN CHURCH ON SUNDAY because he is concerned about the moral well-being of his children and grandchildren. He

knows that the greatest bulwark for morality in the world is the church. He is concerned about the moral well-being of his children. He sees to it that each Lord's Day the family worships God together. The fool couldn't care less. He reads the Sunday paper, spends a few hours down at the office, while his children leisurely stroll to hell.

THE WISE MAN IS IN CHURCH ON SUNDAY because he is concerned about the life of his nation. Communism and socialism are paltry foes as compared with the moral degeneration in America today. America's first line of defense is God. The wise man knows this. That is why he is in church on Sunday, but not the fool. He couldn't care less. The hallmark of his life is apathy.
