

READING FOR RENEWAL

“Renewal” is a very active word these days. Cities are concerned with urban renewal. Some churches are concerned with liturgical renewals, and some persons desire to renew their youth. Many books have been written on the subject of renewal; it is a magnificent thought that life can come out of the ashes of disappointment and ineffectiveness.

A Jewish theologian, Abraham Heschel, wrote recently of the need for renewal: “The greater problem today is not how to preserve the church but how to preserve humanity, threatened not only by the possibility of nuclear explosion, but also by liquidation of the inner man.” It is this renewal of the inner man that many of us seek.

Reading to enrich the soul, to stretch the mind, to give us thoughts beyond those of the writer, this is reading that renews.

Perhaps your favorite mindstretcher, and spirit-lifter is a volume of sermons, or one of devotional literature, or even a book on science that shows the magnitude of creation. Whatever it is, get the book that will do something for you, allow yourself time to read it thoughtfully — make way for renewal. (Taken from February CHRISTIAN HERALD).
