THE SEARCH FOR BLONNYE FOREMAN by Jessie C. Fletcher. "To find a man when you do not know where he is is one thing, when you do not know who he is is quite another."

In 1955, Blonnye Foreman, a veteran Brazilian missionary, disappeared on a flight while working his vast interior field. Several hundred miles to the north another missionary, Jim Musgrave, received word of his disappearance and was sent to search for him.

The author combines spiritual, psychological, and literary as he recreates the events built around this true story. Written in a popular documentary style, the two-streamed biography presents, through flashbacks, the identity and character of Foreman which reveals the searching missionary's own discovery as he conducts the hunt.
