EXTENDED SESSION NEEDS YOU MEN AND WOMEN

The Extended Session for Nursery Departments is a continuation of Sunday School teaching during the Worship services of the church. Parents and other Adult Church members are asked to serve in this ministry one Sunday each month. At least 15 adults are needed EACH Sunday. For a feeling of security the child must have a person familiar to him each time he is brought to his department. Needed also are persons who will serve in times of emergencies when regular workers cannot be present.

Our children are our greatest asset; they are "storing up feelings, reactions and impressions" that are the groundwork for their future behaviour. The Extended Session is a vital part of the child's training. It says to the child and his parent, "First Baptist Church loves its children and wants to minister to their total needs."
