

Our Sunday School Department Superintendents met last Sunday morning for the purpose of turning in their 1970 pledges. These folk have led the way in faithfulness and dedication.




BE SURE THAT YOUR PLEDGE IS IN

Pastor's paragraphs

Bill Hickem is the beloved pastor of the First Baptist Church of Panama City. Some years ago he wrote an article about a mouse who attended church!



"A strange thing happened in the church where I spent my boyhood. It was one of those ordinary Sunday night services where all of us felt the warm glow of the church stove, listened to the swirling wind and snow outside, and endured the voice of the pulpit inside. To a couple of small boys this was the epitome of endurance. Then, with the stillness of the fall of a snowflake, the whole service became worthwhile to us. Right under the old Sunday school library table, and of all places, in the offering plate, was the cutest mouse we had ever seen.

"This mouse had been enjoying the comfort of the church, which included food from the church basement, warmth from the stove, music from the choir, announcements from one of the leading brothers, and sermons from the pastor. He even took time to turn his head as the inflection of the pastor's voice waxed upon him. My young friend whispered an unholy remark to me as he said, 'I wonder if he is a member of the church?' My response to his remark was rewarded with a sound thrashing from my father at the close of the service.

"Oddly enough the impression that has remained with me all these years has not been the trip to the wood shed, but the audacity of the mouse. First, he had no right to cause me discomfort by his presence. Second, who did he think he was to enjoy all the comforts and benefits of our church, and then 'walk' on our offering plates. Finally, why did he choose the church in the first place? His needs could have been better filled in many other places. (Do you suppose we have any 'mousey' church members?)

"In reflecting on this incident in later years, I find a better interpretation of this strange little 'tragic comedy.' The mouse taught a lesson after all. He placed HIMSELF in the offering plate, and none of his wealth could be as important. After all, when you get a Christian to place 'self' in the offering plate you have no problem with giving, attending and serving. Now, your question! What are you putting in the plate?"



My Belief Concerning Tithing

My belief concerning tithing is very basic and simple. Besides all the scriptures which point out plainly God expects a tithe of our substance, there are three other scripture passages upon which my belief is built.

The first two point out the ownership of God. In Psalm 24:1 and I Corinthians 10:26 we find the writer reminds us that the earth is the Lord's and all that is within it. I believe we OWN nothing, but OWE everything to God. Since God has allowed us to possess the many material blessings of life and also allow us to possess our time and abilities, then we must return a portion of them to Him as He has commanded us.

In the third scripture passage, II Corinthians 8:9, we read, "For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich." Realizing how much Jesus was willing to give for us, I feel compelled to return at least a tenth of that which he has given me. For in so doing I feel I have a part in His work which He came to perform and left for us to continue.
