THIS WEEK IS NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK

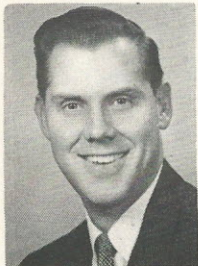


Our Library is having Open House Sunday night at the close of the evening worship hour, especially to give you an opportunity to see their new furnishings.

APOLLO 13—AND RESCUE

By the time you read these lines they will either be safely home or they will have "bought the farm." (This is how the astronauts refer to death.)



The headlines of the morning paper (This is being written early Tuesday a.m.) are not very encouraging. "ASTRONAUTS MISSION CANCELLED: AS-

TRONAUTS IN GRAVE DANGER." The reports are a bit more encouraging now. They have more oxygen aboard than they first thought, but the next few days will still be critical. The lives of three brave men are at stake.

Thousands of people are involved in the rescue. Not just in Houston, but all over the world, the men are working frantically to bring the astronauts back alive. Only God knows how many millions of people are praying for Lovell, Haise and Swigert. This is as it should be.

May God help us to be this concerned to reach men for Christ! Men and women and young people are lost without HIM, you know . . . and we are not talking simply about time and the body, but eternity and the soul. This is lostness with a capital "L".

As far as Apollo 13 is concerned, by now the rescue mission has either been a success or failure, but the rescue mission for the souls of men goes on and on and on.

Thank God for those who have been reached during our revival (Dr. McCall and Jack Kay have richly blessed our hearts.), but remember our rescue mission does not end Friday night. It will go on and on.

The people involved in rescuing the astronauts (If indeed they are rescued.) will have a warm feeling of satisfaction in having a part in this rescue, but there is simply no thrill comparable to having a hand in leading a soul to Jesus. You talk about a thrill!

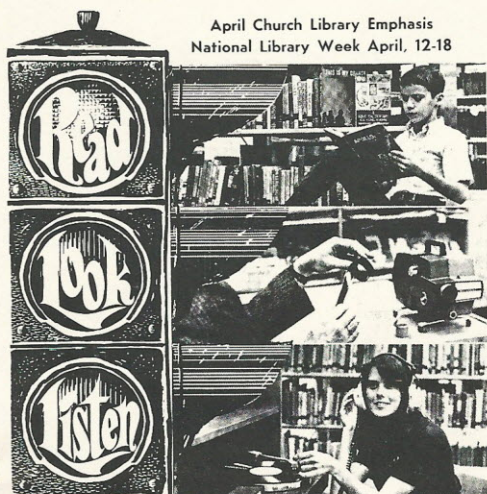
