To keep the land they died to save,

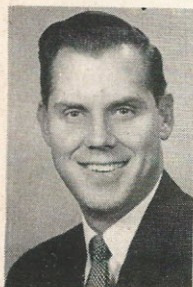
And be ourselves, in turn, the brave!
