


There won't be an offering plate this large in your department, but there will be someone to receive your Pledge Card.

SHOW ME, AND I'LL TITHE

"Show me where the New Testament teaches tithe, and I'll tithe!"

I knew the man spoke the truth. He was an honest Christian, he wanted to do what was right. If he could find that the New Testament taught titheing he would keep his word—he would tithe.

Together we looked at the scriptures. There were not many passages dealing specifically with titheing. We read them together. Matthew 23:23 and Luke 11:42 were similar. "Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye pay tithe of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the law, judgement, mercy, and faith."

Then the key part of the verse in regard to titheing, "These ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone." It was perfectly clear. Jesus was saying we should tithe. We should do much more than tithe, but at the same time we should tithe.

We looked at more of the New Testament. The apostles did not record many direct teachings on titheing using the word tithe. It soon became apparent why. In that day titheing was no problem. It was understood that if you were a Christian you would tithe as a minimum.

Instead of titheing, many early Christians gave their all. The widow gave her mite. Zacchaeus gave half of his goods. Barnabas sold his land to have money to give. Jesus required all of the rich young ruler.

My friend and I completed our search through the New Testament.

Does he tithe now?

Yes, he tithes—but he more than tithes.

"I used to try to determine my giving by the law," he says. "Now my giving is determined by the love of Christ for me, and the need of the world for Christ. My New Testament taught me that titheing is not the place to stop, but rather the place to start!"





YOUTH EVANGELISM CONFERENCE


