



Dr. William E. Hull

Our January Bible Conference with Dr. William E. Hull leading us in study of "The Letters of John" will begin on Sunday.

Dr. Hull is a native Alabamian, a graduate of Howard College (now Samford University) and Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He has served on the faculty of the Southern Baptist Seminary since 1954. He now serves as Dean of the School of Theology.

Dr. Hull will preach at both services Sunday. He will lead in a study during the Christian Training hour, and then on Monday and Tuesday evenings we'll be meeting together at 7:00 each evening.

There will be provisions for Preschool Children, and Miss Dale Mooneyham will lead in a special study for those in Grades 1-5.

It's enough to make a fellow want to change jobs. (Or if he continues in the same occupation, he will certainly want to wear his best suit to work!)



The sign in the teller's window says: "CAMERA WILL FILM ANY HOLDUP ON THESE PREMISES."

When you glance around you will see the same sign all over the bank.

If you expect to find a bank official with a broad smile on his face telling YOU to smile, forget it. The camera

is nowhere to be seen. They have the thing hidden somewhere, but it's there and you had better think twice before you rob any banks, friend.

Evidently the bank has just come up with this idea, but God has been doing it for years. Adam was startled when the Lord said to him, "Adam, smile, you're on candid camera."

Jesus made it perfectly clear that we are always on camera. (God is not taking snapshots at leisure of your life, He is making a movie.) Christ said, "There is nothing hid." Every project of your life and mine is being filmed and previewed by the Great Producer.

Of course, the sign in the bank is a threat, and some make the same mistake of interpreting the words of Jesus in the same way.

"There is nothing hid." To some these words are a threat, but to the wise Christian they are not a threat but a glorious promise. Instead of fearing, they fill the heart with confidence and assurance.

"There is nothing hid." God knows about our fears and frustrations and we can count on Him to satisfy our deepest needs.

God knows and God cares. When you are His child, you can smile whether you are on candid camera or not, regardless of the circumstances!

I trust that when the Lord takes a picture of the congregation Sunday, you'll be in it.


