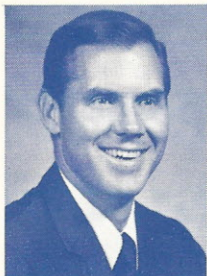

Pastor's Paragraphs

WHAT IS THE OPPOSITE OF LOVE?

Funny that we should think in terms of opposites — but we do. Take this simple word association test. Write down the **FIRST** word that comes into



your mind when you hear the words 1-HOT 2-SWEET 3-WEAK. Now check your answers with those at the bottom of the page. If you get them all right, you are an average person. If you miss one, you probably need to go back to grade school. If you missed all 3, call me and I will refer you to a good psychiatrist!

Like I said, we think in terms of opposites. Now let me give you another word. What is the first word that comes into your mind when you hear the word **LOVE**? The answer, of course, is **HATE**. But hate is not the opposite of love. There are times when love and hate are separated by a very fine line. **THE OPPOSITE OF HATE IS INDIFFERENCE.**

When a husband or wife says "I hate you", (what a pity that a Christian should ever use this language) the case is not hopeless. The home can be saved. But when a husband or wife becomes totally indifferent, the home is in real jeopardy.

Nothing — **BUT NOTHING** — hurts our Lord more than indifference. **HE PREFERS BEING HATED TO BEING IGNORED.** The Laodiceans did not hate Jesus Christ (it would have greatly offended them for anyone to suggest they hated Him). They were just indifferent — and their indifference caused our Lord to grieve.

All of us have a tendency to play the part of the Laodicean. It is so easy to ignore Him. **PLEASE REMEMBER THE OPPOSITE OF LOVE IS NOT HATE, BUT INDIFFERENCE.**

And now, one final test. What is the first word that comes into your mind when you hear the name, **JESUS CHRIST!** . . . but wait — instead of reacting with a word, let's react with a **LIFE!**

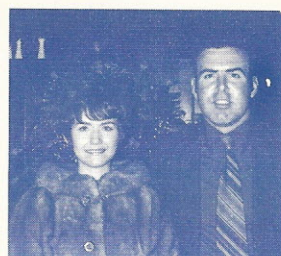
