### LIBRARY NOTES

"THE GOLDEN COAST" by Harnett T. Kane tells of the Gulf Coast area from Key West, Florida to Brownsville, Texas. Here is the America first discovered by Europeans a hundred years before the Pilgrims went to Massachusetts.

Mr. Kane begins his book by telling of the oldest Gulf settlement, our own Pensacola! He takes the reader to Tampa where Henry Plant used moorish architecture in its early days. It seems Mr. Plant raced to develop the West Coast of Florida as Henry Flagler competed to develop the East Coast.

It is interesting to read about the largest settlement of Greeks in the United States at Tarpon Springs. The reader travels on down the coast meeting John Ringling North as he helped develop Sarasota and on through the Everglades, etc.

The journey around the western part of the Gulf takes up in Mobile, going back to the days of the French.

There are visits in Biloxi, Mississippi, and visits to "Beauvoir," the home of Jefferson Davis. Then it is on to New Orleans with its French influence and on to the rich oil ground of Port Arthur and Beaumont, Texas.

You are part of the "Golden Coast" and you will enjoy what Mr. Kane has to say about "our" part of the country!
